



Chancellor's Brigade: NSS Wing orgnised a state level Training Camp on Disaster Preparedness titled as "AVHAN-2013" at Swami Ramanand Tirtha Marathwada University, Nanded from June 2nd to June 12th June 2013. FACULTY ENRICHMENT PROGRAMMES:

Workshop Series on "Excellence in Teaching beyond the Basics": An Advanced Level Training for UIUC Programme

Vidyalankar in collaboration with University of Illinois, Urbana, Champaign, USA conducted a workshop Series on "Excellence in Teaching: Beyond the Basics" for the senior faculty of VSIT, VIT and VP on 21st and 22nd January 2013. The session was directed by Prof. Cheelan Bo-Linn, Center for Teaching Excellence, University of Illinois, Urbana, Champaign, USA and Dr. Dilip Chhajed, Dept of Business Administration, University of Illinois, Urbana, Champaign, USA. The purpose and objective of the workshop was to make the faculty understand the applications of research and public engagement into teaching, to make them ardent with the real concerns of broad academic excellence and help the faculty members in further development of their communication skills and their personality enrichment. It was a two days' workshop consisting of a series of sessions on ways and means to attain excellence in teaching. The first day comprised of Session A on "Formative and Summative Assessment of Student Learning" and Session B on "Principles for Fair and Accurate Grading". On the second day Session C on "Creating a Teaching Philosophy Statement and Portfolio" and Session D on "Moving toward Scholarly Teaching and Classroom Action Research" were held. The workshop provided a platform for faculty to understand the international educational standards and applications of research and public engagement into teaching methodology by creating their own teaching philosophy.









Short Term Training Programme on "Research Basics"

A two day **Short Term Training Programme on "Research Basics"** was conducted on April 18, 2013 and April 22, 2013 for the faculty members of VSIT, VP & VIT with the objective of preparing the faculty for undertaking the Ph.D. programme and making them aware of the techniques of writing and presenting research papers. Further the working of entire clearing process was exhibited wherein the cheques were placed in an IBM MICR Cheque Processing Machine and the machine was able to identify where these cheques came from and they were cleared into different bank pockets accordingly.

Let your ego go, how to let go of ego? Simple! Value your peace above everything else.


PRAY, AIM HIGH & STAY FOCUSED



LOSING MY WAY




Infants we were, but the eyes were high, Been in every profession till we sigh, Small I was &thought the world was big But as I grew up, it was a destiny's gig.

Underneath me-I shook!







We have all heard about global warming & asteroids bombarding us from space. Let us now consider some of the 'other' ways in which life as we know it can seize to exist.

I, ROBOT



People create smart robots, which turn against us& take over the world. We've seen this in movies, TV, & comic books for decades. Current technology is not capable of producing a machine that can think by itself. Yet Hans Moravec, one of the founders of the robotics department of Carnegie Mellon University, predicts that by 2040, machines will match human intelligence, & perhaps human consciousness. Whether this counts as the end of humanity or the next stage in evolution depends on your point of

view. Vernor Vinge has suggested that a moment may come when computers & robots will become smarter that humans. He calls this "the singularity". Vernor believes that a post-singularity world would be unpredictable to humans due to the inability of human beings to imagine the intentions or capabilities of super intelligent entities.

E.T

The universe is billions and billions of light years long. One light year is approximately 9460730472580.8 km's. We 've explored barely 0.01% of this space. Do you really

believe that there is no one else out there? Professional researchers from SETI (Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence) have seriously done work on the possibility of an alien invasion. Many dedicated scientists have been monitoring radio signals in search of a telltale signal from an civilization. Now suppose the long-sought message arrives. The most likely scenario is that aliens would

scavenge through our solar system in search of resources. The history of human exploration and exploitation suggests the most likely danger is not direct conflict. The late physicist Gerard O'Neill speculated that contact with extraterrestrial visitors could be socially disastrous. "Advanced western civilization has had a destructive effect on all primitive civilizations it has come in contact with, even in those cases where every attempt was made to protect and guard the primitive civilization," he said in a1979 interview." I don't see any reason why the same thing would not happen to us."

COLLAPSE OF THE VACUUM

This one seems to come right out of science fiction, if you guessd the same, you are probably right. In the book Cat's Cradle, Kurt Vonnegut popularized the idea of "icenine", a form of water that is far more stable than the ordinary kind, so it is solid at room temperature. Unleash a bit of it, and suddenly all water on Earth transforms to ice-nine and freezes solid. Ice-nine was a satirical invention, but an abrupt, disastrous phase transition is a possibility. Very early in the history of the universe, according to a leading cosmological model, empty space was full of energy. This state of affairs, called a false vacuum, was highly volatile. A new, more stable kind of vacuum appeared and, like icenine, it quickly took over. This transition unleashed a tremendous amount of energy and caused a brief runaway expansion of the cosmos. It is possible that another, even more stable kind of vacuum exixts, however. As the universe expands and cools, tiny bubbles of this new kind of vacuum might appear and spread at nearly the speed of light. The laws of physics would change in their wake, and a blast of energy would dash everything to bits.

BIG BANG, ALL OVER AGAIN

Humans evolved about 13billion years after the Big Bang. The only proof that it ever happened comes from theoretical assumptions and traces of light coming from billions of light years away. Scientists now believe that it is possible to recreate the stellar event. They believe that if they can make two protons collide into each other with enough speed, they can stage a new Big Bang. In theory, they could create millions of them every second. First, imagine an apocalyptic nuclear holocaust; multiply this by infinity. That would only equal a fraction of the magnitude of the Big Bang. Scientists believe that they can contain their Big Bang to a flask. For humanity's sake, let's hope that they are right.
